At Least 1.8 Million Deceased Registered Voters Are On State Voter Rolls

A 2012 Report By Pew Center On The States Found There Were At Least 1.8 Million Deceased People On Voter Rolls

In 2012, The Pew Center On The States Issued A Report That There Was 1.8 Million Dead People Listed As Active Registered Voters. "The nation's voter registration rolls are in disarray, according to a report released Tuesday by the Pew Center on the States. The problems have the potential to affect the outcomes of local, state and federal elections. ... The report found that there are about 1.8 million dead people listed as active voters. Some 2.8 million people have active registrations in more than one state. And 12 million registrations have errors serious enough to make it unlikely that mailings based on them will reach voters." In August 2022, A Federal Judge Rejected The Michigan Secretary Of State's Pleadings To Dismiss Public Interest Legal Foundation's Case Challenging The State's Maintenance Of Voter Rolls. "A federal judge has rejected Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson's effort to dismiss a case challenging Michigan's maintenance of its voter rolls when it comes to removing dead people. U.S. District Court Judge Jane Beckering ruled last week against Benson's motion to dismiss the case based largely on procedural bars she felt the plaintiff, Public Interest Legal Foundation, had met while filing the suit." "The Pennsylvania Department of State has agreed to take steps to remove dead voters from voting rolls in a settlement reached with an election-integrity group that alleged more than 20,000 deceased voters were on the state's rolls. The state agreed to compare its voter-registration database with the nonprofit Electronic Registration Information Center, which includes data from the Social Security Death Index, and to direct all county election commissioners to remove the names of dead voters." Christine Daikawa, 50, entered no contest pleas to charges of making a false statement to obtain or vote an absentee ballot, a misdemeanor, and election fraud by impersonating an elector, a felony." Nine of the 19 were also charged with falsely claiming American citizenship to get on voter rolls." One other, 58-year-old Ramon Esteban Paez-Jerez of the Dominican Republic, had been deported in the 1980s, but returned under a false identity and gained citizenship in 1999." Bruce Rauner was among the first Republican governors to support automatic voter registration. He'd rejected a previous version over concerns of voter fraud, which studies have shown is exceedingly rare. A portion of the law streamlining registrations went into effect in 2018. Full automatic voter registration, which is linked to the state's REAL ID and requires documents proving citizenship, didn't begin in earnest until last summer."
