FOLLOWING THE MONEY: ANTI-ISRAEL PROTEST GROUPS

OVERVIEW

Student protests on college campuses over the Israel-Hamas war are a continuation of the violent Black Lives Matter movement from several years ago. These protests have been orchestrated by various groups, including Students for Justice in Palestine and Jewish Voice for Peace.

For years, researchers have sought to trace the source of the group's funding but it has been difficult as these groups use legal loopholes or are not required to disclose donations. However, left-leaning groups tied to George Soros, along with the Rockefeller Brothers Fund, the Tides Foundation and the Sparkplug Foundation are known sources of funding.
